- Dora Commented that the 4H is a great building our youth. I would like to see us give \$1000.
- Rhonda Graham Commented, at the Boards request, that this program was designed to get more participation of first-time kids. This will help them get started.

Peggy Owens made a motion to Donate \$1000. to the 4H Catch-It-Animal program., Peggy Owens seconded. (All Voted for, None Against) motion carried

- Sedgwick County Chamber of Commerce has asked the Town to be a member. Non-Profit membership is \$50.

Danny Smith made a motion to sign up to be a member for \$50., Peggy Owens seconded. (All Voted for, None Against) motion carried

- **Rhonda Graham – Rural Jump Start Program**

- It's a state funded program that offers incentives to start new businesses in our County. There is nothing the Town need to do; we just want to keep you informed. This will be a County wide program. The commissioners are currently working to get this going.
- The C-Pace is another program, this is for new buildings. This will offer a loan program for energy efficiency as well.
- The Road Map to Recovery is a collaboration of 6 counties to discuss the needs of our communities, i.e. Housing, Senior living and Daycare. And how do we address them.

- **Vickie Sandlin– Explore Magazine.**

- Asking for \$280 this year to keep your ad going. This magazine is designed for travelers coming through our County. This is available at 10 welcome centers, Stanley Hotel, Cripple Creek and virtually. Invoice will be sent in June.

- **Resolution 04-2009 – Board Member Compensation Discussion**

- We need to clarify the interpretation of this Resolution.
 - *Mr. Hodel requested the resolution to be read aloud.*
- Dora Devie doesn't feel the need of compensation for doing her civic duty. Bill Boler expressed the same feelings.
- Legal Counsel reminded the Board that any changes will not affect this board, only the board coming into office at the next election. But we can clarify how we interpret this ruling and enforce it going forward correctly.
- After discussing this, the Board has interpreted the discount to be the base fee of the \$42.95 each month. So, all water overages should be paid by the Members. This would have the same effect on all board members bills. Additionally, directed the Town Clerk to consult with the accounting team to clarify if this is something that taxes should be taken from it. (W2 or 1099)

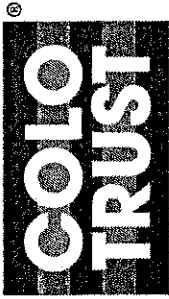

We have offered a "compensation" of sorts to our Board Members in the form of the base water fee.. \$42.95 a month. We have a citizen that says this is not allowed unless we pay employment taxes out of it. We consider it like a discount. A thank you, since our Board are not employees and that is the only thing they get for their service to our Town.

This would add up to \$515.40 a year.

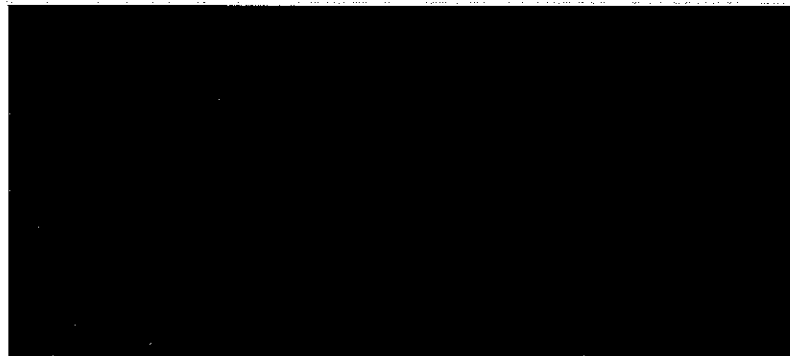

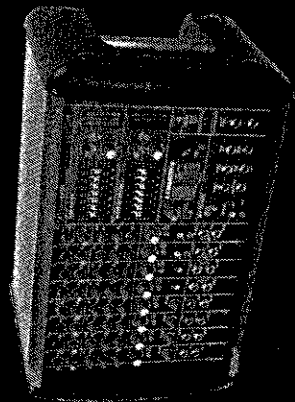
